4.4 Contract Management and Staffing

Section 5.8. Contract Insurance Requirements

This subsection shall read:

5.8.2 Limitation of Liability:

Except as otherwise set forth in Sections IX. J. and K., the Indemnification Provisions of the New York State Health Department Contract, the limit of liability shall be as follows:

- Contractor's liability for any claim, loss or liability arising out of, or connected with the Products and services provided, and whether based upon default, or other liability such as breach of contract, warranty, negligence, misrepresentation or otherwise, shall in no case exceed direct damages in: (i) an amount equal to two (2) times the original contract value exclusive of renewals, or (ii) one million dollars (\$1,000,000), whichever is greater; provided, however, that in accordance with applicable professional standards, such limitation of liability shall not apply to the financial statement audit services performed by Contractor.
- 2. The STATE may retain such monies from any amount due Contractor as may be necessary to satisfy any claim for damages, costs and the like asserted against the STATE unless Contractor at the time of the presentation of the claim shall demonstrate to the STATE's satisfaction that sufficient monies are set aside by the Contractor in the form of a bond or through insurance coverage to cover associated damages and costs.
- 3. Notwithstanding the above, neither the Contractor nor the STATE shall be liable for any consequential, indirect or special damages of any kind which may result directly or indirectly from such performance, including, without limitation, damages resulting from loss of use or loss of profit by the STATE, the Contractor, or by others.

All other terms and conditions remain the same.
